

FOUR SQUARE

This is the perfect game for you and a group of friends looking to get outside and have a fun-filled day. Four Square is kind of like Tennis, except you have no racquet. Your racquet is your two hands. You simply hit a ball to someone else so they can hit it back to you... but there are rules. Read below to find out how to play!

What you'll need

- At least 4 friends
- Chalk
- Rubber Ball (soccer ball size)

Getting started

1. Take your chalk and draw a 6-foot by 6-foot square.
2. Divide the 6-foot square into four equal sized squares. Number the squares 1 through 4.

1=Beggar— this is the lowest position you can be in.

2=Joker— You're getting closer, only two more spots from King.

3=Queen— You might be royalty, but you still aren't a King yet.

4=King— This is the ultimate position to be in. You get to start out each game with a serve.

Court Lines

- Outside Lines are in-bounds. This means that the ball can land on or touch any part of the outside line and still be in play.
- Inside lines are out-of-bounds. If the ball lands on or touches any part of the inside line, the player who hit the ball last is out and must move to square 1 (Beggar) or go to the back of the line (if there are more than four players).

Hitting the Ball

The standard way to hit the ball is underhanded. This means that all hits are with an open hand, palms up.

Other variations could include:

- **Double Taps:** After the ball bounces once in your square, you would hit the ball two times in the air and pass to another square.
- **Body Language:** Players can use any part of their body to hit the ball.
- **Black Jack:** If a player catches the ball before it lands in their square, the player who hit the ball is out.

Let's Play

- Each player will choose a square to stand in.
- The player in square four (King) will serve the ball by bouncing it in their square once and hitting it to any of the other three squares.
- The receiving player will then let the ball bounce once in his square and hit it to another square.

*The ball can ONLY bounce one time. If it bounces twice in someone's square, that person is out and must move to square 1 (Beggar) or the back of the line. All other players will move up to the next square available. (1 will go to 2, 2 will go to 3, and 3 will go to 4)

Object of the game: To be in the King's position.
